2003 brought some big changes to the Montgomery County Health Department. The health office has been very busy this year with flu shots and bioterrorism preparedness. Both of these fall under the Health Nurse's jurisdiction.

The flu season was very busy this year. 856 shots were given by the health department in several locations. The nurse intends to set up all-day mass vaccination clinics next fall. This will also be good practice for bioterrorism preparedness.

For bioterrorism, we have ordered several pieces of equipment to better prepare us in the event of an emergency. We used funds given to each county health department by the CDC. We have participated in several table top exercises with other counties in District 4 to see how well we work together as a district. In February 2004 our county has to have a plan in place for emergency preparedness.

Another positive change has been the addition of a microbiology laboratory. We are able to test well water for coliform bacteria, surface ditchwater and other public waterways for coliform and E coli. We also offer testing for swimming pools and spas, this checks heterotrophic plate counts and coliform bacteria.

We provided funds for 300 Tar Wars T-shirts. 5<sup>th</sup> grade students in Montgomery County school systems received these shirts and hopefully learned the importance of staying tobacco free.
